Prince in Foreclosure



The Carver County Sheriff's Office reports that the Rock and Roll Hall of Famer has fallen behind \$368,382 on his 20-acre former home in the Minneapolis suburb that has been his home since 1980. However, he no longer lives there and had it leveled in 2005. The property is valued at \$1.15 million.

It is believed that the foreclosure will not place for the musician. There is so much happening with the banks and homeowners.

Bank of America and its Countrywide unit is scheduled to pay \$8.5 billion to settle claims that the lenders sold poor-quality mortgage-backed securities that went sour when the housing market collapsed.

Federal Reserve Bank of New York, Pimco Investment Management, and Blackrock Financial argued that Countrywide enriched itself at the expense of investors by continuing to service bad loans while running up servicing fees.

John Mackey Dies

Five-Time Pro Bowler Suffered from Dementia



Tight end, John Mackey, who was the second tight end inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame, died Wednesday. He was 69.

Mackey had been dealing with frontotemporal dementia and became very confused. In 2006 he became angry when he saw Indianapolis Colts Marvin Harrison wearing the No. 88 jersey that he used to wear. He re-visioned the position during his nine seasons with the Baltimore Colts and served as the first president of the NFL players' association. In Super Bowl V, he reeled in a pass while playing the Dallas Cowboys and scampered into the end zone for a then-Super Bowl record 75-yard touchdown reception. He finished his career with the San Diego Chargers.

Mackey missed just one game during his 10-season career.

Murdoch's News of the World Shuts Down

Median titan, including Fox News, Rupert Murdoch, seeking to protect his News Corp. empire by stanching damage from a deepening phone-hacking scandal Thursday, is sacrificing the mass-circulation British weekly News of the World. The closure means the end of the 168 year old paper with a circulation of more than 2.5 million and generates about \$61 million a year. The scandal has taken a toll on News Corp.-Fox News, The Wall Street Journal, the New York Post and the online app, The Daily, driving down its stock price. Some advertisers were fleeing.

Fox News is known for passing on misinformation to the public. On February 14, 2003, a Florida Appeals Court ruled there is absolutely nothing illegal about deliberately lie or distort the news on a television broadcast.

The final issue of News of the World would include no paid advertising.

If Talks Do Not Work, The Pen Will

Treasury Department officials have warned that the current \$14.3 trillion debt ceiling has to be raised by August 2 to avoid a potential default. President Obama has the power to control this serious fight.

The president said Thursday that he will not sign any agreement that fails to raise the debt ceiling beyond the 2012 election. However, he has not said that he will not protect this country and utilize the 14th Amendment for debt, even though Republican lawmakers have stated that they will take him to court if he uses the 14th Amendment to save Americans.

Congress first placed a statutory limit on total federal debt in 1917 in the Second Liberty Bond Act. Since 1962 it has altered the limit through 74 separate measures, raising it 10 times since 2001.

Debt being considered valid is completely different than defaulting on interest payments for that debt. You can only default on valid debt as determined by Congress. Therefore, it is recommended that our lawmakers first determine what debt is valid.

In spite of how the majority in Washington continues to fight the president regarding the debt ceiling they are fighting harder to decrease social security, medicare and medicare benefits. They continue to increase or retain tax benefits for the wealthy on the backs of middle and lower income Americans. Their fight reaps of greed and selfishness as regular Americans suffer.

The present administration should not have continued the Bush tax benefits to the wealthy without a stipulation requiring them to create jobs. As it now stands, the tax benefits only place heavier pads in the pockets of the wealthy with no penalties if they don't contribute to the economy in a sharing manner.

One Vision, One City

It was an awesome occasion as the City of Jacksonville, the nation's 15th and Florida's largest city, watched it's new mayor get sworn in with a theme, one vision, one city.

As a very religious, giving man, Mayor Brown initiated his inauguration festivities with a mock ceremony the day before for the city's youth.

Not using taxpayers money, Mayor Brown had a prayer breakfast with Bishop T. D. Jakes, Dallas, TX, as the main speaker. Other powerful men in the ministry joining him included a Hindu priest, a Jewish rabbi, and Father Peter Church from First Coast Christian Outreach.

Casey Anthony Not Guilty - Caylee's Law Initiated



It took 33 days of testimony, 400 pieces of evidence and more than 90 witnesses for the Florida jury to reach a verdict for Casey Anthony of 'not guilty' of the murder of her 2-year-old daughter, Caylee. Casey's attorney told the jury that she was a victim of an abusive upbringing.

Casey continually changed her stories regarding her daughter's disappearance and finally said she and her father found her floating in their above-ground pool.

Much of the country is very disturbed, even though the judge gave her maximal sentence and fines for her four untruths to the police as they seek information on the cost to the community for Casey's many lies.

Casey is scheduled to be free on July 17 and is also scheduled for a deposition regarding the story she told about a baby sitter and her job in Orlando.

To avoid another such event, four states have drafted what they are calling, 'Caylee's Law' in which it will be a felony if a child is not reported missing within a certain number of hours. Florida is one of the states seeking the passage of such a law. If this law had been in place in 2008, Casey would not be going free this month.

What Can One Person Do?

Activist Reveals How One Act of Community Service Can Spark Thousands More

Don't tell Lisa Sellman that one person can't make a difference. She knows better. Sellman, a community activist and lifelong volunteer, recently learned how one act of kindness can set off a chain reaction that can span the globe.

"It just started out with me asking a regional pet food company for a donation of dog food for Red Lake Rosie's in Minnesota," said Sellman, a professional dog trainer and owner of a pet care business. "I called Solid Gold Northland, and one of the marketing managers there advised me that they were trying to increase the number of people who 'liked' them on Facebook, and that if I could get 40 new Facebook members to click on their 'like' button, they'd give me \$200 worth of pet food."

So Sellman, who currently volunteers for six different community groups, sent a message out to all her Facebook friends inviting them to Solid Gold Northland's fan page on Facebook. Somehow, the invite made it to the Facebook page of The Patrick Miracle, a page devoted to the story of a two year old pitbull found by a janitor in a dumpster. Their Facebook page has charted over 109,000 "like" clicks from users. When the founders of the page posted Sellman's invite, Solid Gold Northland received more than 2,000 new fans from all over the world in the course of about 48 hours.

"When I contacted them the next week, they were blown away by how quickly the response took off," said Sellman, also author of the children's book *The Legend of the Wolves of Gunflint Lake* (www.dreamcatcherpress.us), which contains the theme of the value of community service and which she hopes will serve to inspire others. "As a result of the combined outreach, Solid Gold Northland and Chuck and Don's Pet Food Outlet have committed a donation of \$2,000 worth of pet food, and I've helped to forge new friends from other countries who all care about the same things I care about. And it all started with a simple posting on Facebook because I wanted to help a local animal shelter. It's been magical."

Sellman's simple act was a drop in the bucket compared to her schedule of volunteer activities. She works as an after school care volunteer at the Minneapolis Indian Center, a special events assistant at the Loft Literary Center, a volunteer marketing director for canine events at the Gunflint Lodge (the real location contained in her children's book), and a trail staff assistant with Wilderness Inquiry, where she and her husband take disabled children and adults on outdoor adventures throughout the US. They've been volunteers with this organization since 1997.

"Although I work hard, I love being able to serve my community," Sellman said. "The people in all the organizations I'm involved with, all share my values and my world view and they are my friends and my family. The people and the activities fill up my life with fun, joy and a purpose I could never have achieved any other way. It doesn't mean that I think everyone should take the same path that I have. I know most people don't have the time. My point is this: it only takes one simple act, one click of a mouse button to start a movement. It happened to me and it can happen to you. All you need to do is give it a shot."

About Lisa Sellman: Lisa Sellman, owner and professional dog trainer at Aloha Pet Care & Dog Training, volunteers for half a dozen charitable organizations. She believes that community service is its own reward, a message that resonates throughout her new children's book *The Legend of the Wolves of Gunflint Lake*.
